## Passion

February 2018 holds an interesting coincidence that intertwines sacred and secular traditions of passion: Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day both fall on the same day this year. The last time such an alignment happened was 1945; you can imagine the level of penitence and ardor that arose from this church at that time. With more than 12 million US forces engaged across the globe, it is likely every family had members serving in the armed forces.

Valentine's Day is thick in our culture. From our youngest schooldays into our golden years, many of us participate in the festivities by exchanging cards, candy, flowers, and songs that express eagerness for a new flame or devotion to a lifelong soulmate. When I was in high school, each Valentine's Day I bought dozens of carnations from a local florist and bestowed one on each girl I knew, letting them all know they weren't left out: they were part of the excitement too. The thrill of that simple gift and its response remain in my memory today.

This year, whether you have a day of wine and roses or one that seems like any other day, please come and gather in our sanctuary at 7:00 PM to experience a different kind of attraction. On Ash Wednesday evening, we'll begin the remembrance we draw each year during Lent, following the final steps of the son of man who loved the world in a way it did not expect—in a way some still do not expect. Jesus loved people wholly and openly, even after their missteps and compromises. Jesus taught that when one lost sheep is found, the Good Shepherd calls together his friends and rejoices. (Luke 15) Jesus knew that when you return home, God rushes to you, adorns you with the finest robe, puts a ring on your hand, and throws a party. (Luke 15) In short, God lets all of us know we are part of the excitement, even when we feel forgotten.

## Session Recap

The session met on Dec. 6, 2017 and Jan. 3, 2018.

In December, we interviewed the newly-elected Deacons and Elders, heard the report of the Deacons Mission giving, planned for Christmas services, the Christmas Tea, and the Removing of the Greenery. We recognized the repair work on the Steeple and reviewed the most recent financial reports. We ensured all staff were advised of salary adjustments and approved Christmas gifts. We adjusted our terms for a Stated Supply Pastor to attract qualified candidates. We approved Jan. 14 to Ordain & Install church officers and approved the 2018 Communion schedule. Russ Volmar agreed to supervise Property and Sara Winkelmann agreed to supervise Finance.

In January, we acknowledged collecting \$585 for the Christmas Joy Offering and confirmed our contribution to the 2018 General Mission Pledge. We thanked Jim for arranging Pulpit Supply for January (Nicole Melara) and noted the Soup Cook-Off on Jan. 14. We discussed the proper use of the Parking Lot and will write an official policy. We thanked Barb for helping change our Insurance renewal date to Nov. so it is not an issue during Christmas vacation. We reviewed the 2017 final financial reports. We adjusted the terms for a Stated Supply Pastor again to include Medical contributions. We elected Andrew Byshenk as the Clerk for 2018 and Dick Seeling as the Treasurer for 2018.
